## **UPGRADE OF PREMISES**

We are delighted that finally the upgrade of our premises is taking place. The main changes you will see are the 2 new consulting rooms which can be found at the end of the corridor as you come in. These will be consulting rooms 5 and 6 and will mean they are much more accessible from the waiting room. Whilst we are not getting any additional rooms within the building we are moving around certain areas of our current space particularly in relation to our main reception area. Another welcome feature will be the redesign of the front door area which means both front doors will now become automatic so you will no longer need to hunt for the elusive front door button!

As with all building works there will be the downside of increased noise and upheaval during the upgrade phase and we apologise for this. There will also be additional problems relating to parking whilst the building contractors are on site – so if it is at all possible for you to get dropped of and picked up from your appointments this may well help prevent you from circling looking for a parking space. We hope however this short spell of disruption will be worth it for it for the longer term benefit for both you the patients and ourselves.

Please also note that during these building works the Health Centre will be closed to patients every Wednesday from 1pm to allow the particularly noisy alterations to take place. However the doctors and staff will continue to work in the building during this time and in the event of an emergency can still be contacted by telephoning the Balfour Hospital on 888000.

- A full range of contraceptive services, including emergency contraception, coil and implanon insertions
- Advice on termination of pregnancy
- Sexual health advice for gay men, including HIV testing and hepatitis vaccination

Patients can phone our dedicated telephone number from 9 am till 5pm Monday to Friday, and will usually be offered an appointment within 48 hours. If it is difficult to attend in person we can give advice over the phone as part of a booked telephone consultation.
